#### Study Support Worker for Disabled People/Carers

Elgin, 2hrs weekly

Lead volunteers support disabled young people, disabled adults and carers through a course of learning, whether it be for fun, for work or self-development. Volunteers receive induction, further training, travel expenses and on-going support. Most of our volunteers offer one-to-one support.


Many learners ask for learning support such as talking through challenges and sharing skills and knowledge of a subject. Some ask for practical support such as scribing, typing up notes and being accompanied to college. Our learners have a diverse range of interests and learning goals. For example some wish to improve their IT skills and require the experience and knowledge of a volunteer to demonstrate IT applications, where-as others are seeking guidance and encouragement through a course of study. Lead recognises that volunteers too have varying and wide-ranging interests and skills, and we will ensure you are matched up with a compatible learner.

### **Darby & Joan Club Volunteers**

Lossiemouth, Tuesday's 12.30-1.30 and 15.15-16.00

The Darby and Joan Club is remarkable – it has been going for quite some time – it is a fixture of community life and a valuable resource for many older people in Lossiemouth. The Club needs volunteers to help keep it going, including a rather urgent need for a volunteer bus escort – helping older folk on and off the bus.





### **Moray Handyperson's Service**

Various

Carry out small jobs to help people who are elderly, disabled or disadvantaged who have no friends or family able to assist them, to maintain a better quality of life in their own homes.

Volunteer Handypersons carry out small jobs of a practical nature: such as replacing light bulbs/tubes, fitting door chains/security/safety devices, putting up shelving/pictures/curtain tracks/poles, shifting pieces of heavy furniture, one off gardening tasks and much besides.

The service is free to the client, who is only required to provide any goods necessary to complete the task. We cannot tackle major works, nor do we replace the help of local trades people. Jobs are generally felt to take about an hour or so but more than one may be undertaken in a single or return visit. Volunteers can be of any age and either gender, providing you have good DIY and interpersonal skills. You will require a car and phone to undertake tasks.

#### **Moray Art Centre – Member of Board of Directors**

What might you be doing?

- Interviewing clients
- Finding, interpreting and communicating information so clients can make an informed decision
- Act on behalf of clients
- Negotiating, referring and drafting letters for clients, filling in forms.
- Completing clear case records
- Recognising the root cause of problems and participating in taking action



#### Does this sound like you?

- Excellent communication skills (verbal and written)
- Open, approachable an enthusiastic
- Ablé to sift through information and extract what is relevant
- Respectful of views and values which may be different from your own.
- Able to work within a team
- Able to use computers
