Habitat Restoration Volunteer

Across Moray, Saturday's and Tuesday's

Wild things! started their Habitat Restoration Project in 2014 in response to the growing problem of invasive non-native plants in Moray.

Over the last few years it has become apparent that plants such as giant hogweed, Japanese knotweed and Himalayan balsam are spreading at an alarming rate; reducing space and nutrients available to our native plants. We work with volunteers to control the invasive plants, whilst offering people opportunities to build upon their skills and experience and increase their employability.

Through our Habitat Restoration Project, Wild things! aims to: Help our native flowers to regenerate by controlling invasive plants. Provide opportunities for people to develop new skills and experience. Offer training in a range of areas including the safe use of pesticides, first aid and naturalist subjects. Support people in taking gentle exercise and spending more time in the outdoors.

When does the Habitat Restoration Project run? Almost every Saturday throughout the summer 10am-3pm. Frequent sessions on Tuesday evenings, around 6pm-8pm (times are subject to change).

Wild things! can offer a local pick up if you do not have your own transport, and will provide protective clothing, all necessary tools and equipment, and tea and coffee!
