Lived/Living Experience (LLE) panel glossary / Jargon Jar

- ADP: Moray Alcohol and Drug Partnership Established to respond to national strategies and implement change in Moray. Accountable to the Community Planning Partnership with membership from main agencies such as health, police, social care, lived experiences etc. Website contains key resources.
- Pathway Term often used to refer to a referral pathway in the services that support treatment of alcohol and drug use. See the separate document that shows the current pathway to treatment.
- RRR: Rights, Respect, Recovery Sottish national strategy for improving health by preventing and reducing alcohol and drug use, harm and related deaths. Published in 2018 and key document that led to the MAT standards.
- MAT: Medication Assisted Treatment Standards Evidence based standards to enable the
 consistent delivery of safe, accessible, high-quality drug treatment across Scotland. Aim to reduce
 drug related harms and deaths. Led by MIST (Medication Assisted Treatment Implementation
 Support Team) nationally. Created by the Drug Deaths Task Force in 2021.
- <u>National Drugs Mission Plan 2022-2026</u> the Scottish strategy that ADP's like Moray's use to create their own delivery plans.
- <u>National Collaborative</u> Their vision is to integrate human rights into drug and alcohol policy leading to better outcomes for people affected by substance use. Their charter of rights is being firmed up from a draft created in 2023 following events in 2024. This will be a key document for LLE panel to use.
- ARROWS: Name of the commissioned service in Moray hosted by Quarriers providing drug and alcohol support. Services are also part of the local referral pathway. Currently located on Elgin High Street.
- MIDAS: Moray Integrated Drug and Alcohol Services Currently based at North Guildry Street Elgin. Supports individuals from medical perspective of recovery including prescriptions and detoxification.
- <u>Naloxone</u> Medication that rapidly reverses opioid (e.g. heroin) overdose. Free training available for anyone to enable carrying this life saving treatment.
- <u>SDF Scottish Drugs Forum</u> National charity whose vision is a Scotland free from drug-related health and social harm. They offer training and resources, a central point for trusted information.
- <u>SRC: Scottish Recovery Consortium</u> Supports, represents and connects recovery. Offer range of events, resources and supports specific to substance recovery.
- Scottish Recovery Network Focus on mental health recovery and the value of peer-support to achieve transformation of the mental health system. Key resources to be found in their peer recovery hub. Work closely with Moray Wellbeing Hub locally.
